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Evacuees must bring a copy of the letter from Alberta Health to their first visit with a family physician to book a chest x-ray at an Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada approved radiology clinic, where evacuees will not receive a fee for service. This letter includes a list of immigration-approved clinics and panel physicians where the X-ray can be performed.

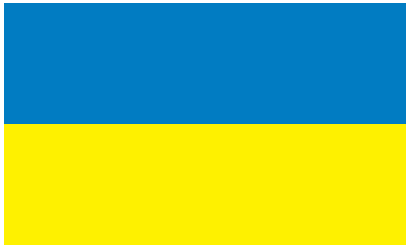

Your Healthcare Options in Alberta

We are here to support the health of you and your family. We want to help you receive the care you need when you need it.

If you are experiencing a medical emergency call **911**

For all other health concerns, physical or mental, call 811 to speak to a nurse 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and find out where to go for healthcare that is right for you.

If you need to speak to someone in a language that is not English, simply say the language you wish to speak in and an interpreter will be added to the conversation.

When you call 811, a nurse can help you access these healthcare options:

Family Doctor

Your best option for ongoing health needs, including access to prenatal care if needed, is to find a family doctor.

Walk-In Clinics

If you don't have a family doctor, some communities have walk-in clinics that often don't require an appointment. Walk-in clinics are staffed by family physicians.

Emergency Departments/Urgent Care Centres

Emergency care is for those who are seriously ill or injured. Patients with potentially life-threatening conditions should immediately call 911.

Community & Public Health Centres

Services include adult and child immunizations, pre and post-natal programs, education/counselling/support for parents, health assessment and screening to identify health concerns, and referral to appropriate health care providers such as physicians, and community resources.

Tuberculosis Testing and Treatment

Free tuberculosis (TB) skin testing and other TB services, including the provision of free TB medications, are done at public health centres throughout the province.

COVID-19 Immunizations

You can book an immunization appointment or get immunized by walking in to certain clinics or pharmacies.

Pharmacists

Pharmacists fill and renew prescriptions, provide COVID-19 and some other immunizations, assess minor condition symptoms, offer treatment or refer you to the most appropriate treatment location. COVID-19 rapid test kits are available at pharmacies for use at home.

HIV Services

Outpatient clinics offer assessment, treatment, education and support for people diagnosed with HIV, including access to anti-retroviral medication and referrals to primary care physicians.

Sexually Transmitted Infections Services

Clinics provide assessment, diagnosis, testing and treatment for sexually transmitted and blood borne infections.

*****IMPORTANT NOTICE*****

Please take this letter with you when you make your first visit with a Family Physician or Nurse Practitioner (NP) in Alberta. They will give you the information you need to book a **Chest X-ray**, which is required for everyone 11 years of age or older coming to Canada from a country where infections with Tuberculosis are more common. This should be done as soon as possible, and ideally within a couple of weeks of arrival.

You will not have to pay for this service if you present your new Alberta Health Insurance card.

This X-ray can also be used for the Medical Diagnostic Test for Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (visa) purposes if you have it done at one of the immigration-approved radiology clinics. Your physician or Nurse Practitioner will let you know which radiology clinics are approved for this service.

The clinic where you have your Chest X-ray will then give you a list of Immigration-appointed doctors with whom you can book the remainder of your Medical Diagnostic Test. This test must be completed within 90 days after arrival in Canada.

Ukrainian Evacuee Temporary Health Benefits Program

Ukraine evacuees arriving in Alberta on February 24, 2022, or after (those who have evacuated Ukraine or cannot return to Ukraine), will be covered under the Ukrainian Evacuee Temporary Health Benefits Program (UETHBP).

This program will provide temporary coverage to Ukrainian evacuees who do not qualify for registration and coverage under the Alberta Health Care Insurance Plan (AHCIP) and Hospital Benefits Plan or other public health benefits because they are not considered residents or deemed residents, as defined in the Alberta Health Care Insurance Act. In the coming weeks, evacuees will be enrolled to receive the benefits provided in the Alberta Adult Health Benefit (AAHB) or Alberta Child Health Benefit (ACHB) supplementary plans.

Alberta Health requests your support in providing pharmacy services to Ukrainian evacuees who are without a Personal Health Number (PHN), medical history or active health benefit coverage. Evacuees may present for pharmacy services before they are enrolled with the UETHBP, receive a PHN or have active health benefit coverage.

DISPENSING FOR EVACUEES

If a Ukrainian evacuee presents to your pharmacy with an active prescription, please do the following:

- Confirm the prescription is a regular benefit within the Alberta Drug Benefit List (ADBL) or Human Services Drug Benefit Supplement (HSDBS) under the AAHB or ACHB category: ab.bluecross.ca/dbl/idbl_main1.php.
- Dispense the prescription as per normal pharmacy procedures and **retain the receipt**.
- As health benefit coverage is not active, do not request payment from the evacuee.
 - Coverage under the AAHB or ACHB will be facilitated and available in the days ahead for active billing.
- In the interim, pharmacies will be reimbursed for the medication(s) dispensed to an evacuee. The process for reimbursement is under development.
 - **Note:** reimbursement will only be provided for drug products found within the ADBL and/or the HSDBS and will follow dispensing rules or frequencies of the AAHB or ACHB supplementary plans.

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PHARMACY BENEFACT

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PHARMACY SERVICES

- If a Ukrainian evacuee presents to your pharmacy without an active prescription, a pharmacist who has been granted additional prescribing authority may prescribe to initiate drug therapy, as appropriate, and/or manage ongoing drug therapy OR a pharmacist may utilize prescribing in emergency, as appropriate.
- Pharmacies will be reimbursed for providing clinical services as per the Ministerial Order for Pharmacy Services Compensation Plan. Only the clinical services listed above will be reimbursed. The process for reimbursement is under development.
- COVID-19, influenza and any other vaccine administration will be solely supported through Alberta Health Services.

Alberta Health anticipates a limited number of Ukrainian evacuees requiring pharmacy services, and the current process outlined in this Benefact will be a short-term solution.

If a pharmacy provides pharmacy services to an evacuee, please ensure you have the most appropriate or current contact information, as your pharmacy team may need to contact the evacuee once the reimbursement process is established.
